## 7. O.P.P. Report

- Detailed reports were distributed prior to the meeting for review and to allow for effective discussion at the Board meeting
- OPP Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott provided a comprehensive overview and explanation of the November and December reports
- Property related and drug crime remains prevalent in South Huron, but is similar across municipalities
- Traffic hazards are up slightly
- South Huron participated in the Festive Ride program and the OPP is currently awaiting feedback from Officers
- Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott noted that the sale of cannabis edibles has started in Ontario and believes there will be some impact/increase towards health related calls
- Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott addressed an incident that occurred in South Huron and that a Special Investigations Unit (SIU) investigation is taking place
- There has been a soft launch for Mobile Crisis, Rapid Response Team, there is currently 1 member, riding with officers. Officers have seen results and more instances where the first calls placed to the Mobile Crisis, Rapid Response Team resulted less strain on local resources both policing and health related
- Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott suggested that the member of the Mobile Crisis, Rapid Response Team speak at a Police Service Board meeting to explain their position
- The Annual OPP “Stuff-a-Cruiser” event was a complete success. The event collected much needed food items, toiletries and cash for those living in Huron County. All donations received through the event were donated to the Huron County Food Bank Distribution Centre.

- MVC OPP Cruiser struck head on.

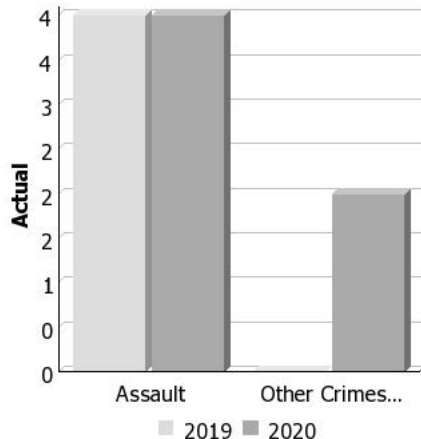
