- Block Training resumed in September
- School resource officer – seeking backfill person during absence of resource officers

- Mental Health calls have increased over the same period last year

Public Education Campaigns:	<p>12 Media releases were issued this past month pertaining to county-wide information and/or public education campaigns.</p> <p>We continue to encourage people to always secure their property and to not leave valuables in their vehicles. Theft of Motor Vehicles and contents of the vehicles is still an on-going concern throughout the County including South Huron.</p>

Continuous Learning:	<p>Block Training resumed in September. Other Virtual courses are also coming online. TTCI – General Investigative Training and the Coach Officer Course to name a few.</p>

School/Youth Officer Hours / Calls for Service:	<p>There were five incidents in November at South Huron Schools. 3 were minor calls at the Exeter Public School. One property related call at Precious Blood Catholic School and one Traffic related occurrence at SHDHS where a 17 year old male was charged with Stunt Driving for doing a burn out on the street near the school and also Careless driving when he failed to stop at 2 posted stop signs.</p>

	<p>The school resource officer has been engaged with the South Huron schools. We also have our Community Safety Officer Jamie Stanley engaged with these schools as well. They are maintaining regular contact with the school administrative staff and working through any issues that might arise. School presentations are happening to the classes within the COVID19 guidelines the school has developed.</p>
Community Mobilization Officer:	<p>There were 17 mental health calls for service in South Huron in November. Up from 15 in the same month in 2019.</p>
Focused Patrol Initiatives:	<p>There is one focused patrol currently in South Huron during the month of November. The Huron OPP are currently running focused patrols with the South Huron area schools. This is to support school safety. Officers are patrolling the schools on foot and by cruiser curbing poor behaviour and supporting school staff with the re-opening policies. Also road safety is one of our priorities as well. Reducing risk of injury by deterring poor driving behaviour.</p> <p>South Huron had no calls for service related to COVID19 in November.</p>
Community Events:	<p>None scheduled during this time period.</p>

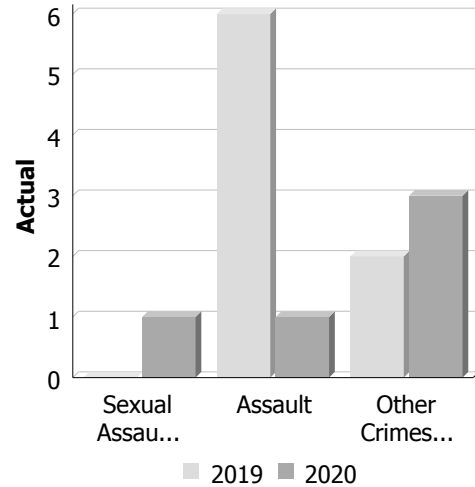

Crisis Team member continues to be engaged with proactive and reactive responses within Huron County throughout the COVID19 Crisis trying to further reduce these numbers.

With the ever changing position on closures from the Province we are always fielding questions from the Public on allowable limits on social events.• Planning is underway on how to deliver course material to students using a COVID19 approved method. Consultation with the school boards is on-going.• Dealing with Mental Health calls and managing residents in crisis. Utilizing all available resources from CMHA, Social Services. MCRRT and Out of the Cold shelter and counselling services.

Still having issues with minor preventable thefts with a few simple preventative measures.• COVID19 - Focus on education while ensuring the safety of the public.• Complete Crime Abatement checks on criminals currently charged with offences, on conditions and at high risk for re-offending• Stay current on the changing rules as the Province slowly tightens restrictions during this 2nd wave of the Pandemic now that Huron-Perth are in condition orange.
