- Staff Sgt David Sinko provided a comprehensive overview and explanation of the January report and noted that new format requested by the Board.
- The Board made note that calls for serve for January as listed per month seems high, Staff Sgt Sinko will check and confirm if it is for the month, will also check if report shows county wide and not just South Huron.
 - Staff Sgt Sinko explained the stats for January, 286 calls for service. Staff Sgt Sinko will look into it further as the report may include split calls but that the report appears to be accurate
- Year over year there have been no major changes in report numbers
- Clearance rates discussed, rate depends on how arrest is made and that yearly percentages are a more true indicator of clearance rates versus monthly percentages
- Crime Stoppers report was not available at the printing of the O.P.P Report
- Media releases being sent out regarding education, traffic conditions, and safety throughout South Huron
- Violent crimes remain unchanged
- Mobile Crisis Response Team worker has been engaged in proactive work and is a shared resource between Huron Perth and Stratford Police with access to services on the front line.
 - The Chair stated that to have accesses to a Mobile Crisis Team worker is a great resource to have in the community and surrounding area.
- OPP are reminding members of the community to lock their vehicles when not in use, to drive according to weather conditions and drive slow during winter weather storms

Number of Targeted Media Releases:	Five media releases were placed on the Huron County Media Portal relating to South Huron Media releases are put out to in an attempt to educate, create awareness, and emphasize the need for the public's help in solving crimes.
